FOREWORD

This is the record, as far as it is known to the compilers, of the family of George Washington Vernon (1820-1901)----his ancestors and descendants. Some historical material, reproduced here from older sources, is included to indicate the origin of the family. Information regarding the later generations is limited in most cases to dates of births, marriages and deaths, plus a few biographical facts where these are known. In a few instances more detailed information is given. As far as we know, the facts included here are accurate, although the sources are not always given. In general, variant spellings have been allowed to stand as they appeared in old records and documents.

The numbers preceding the names are for reference purposes only. They provide a ready means of identification and are especially useful in cases where two or more persons bear the same name.

Since these facts were gathered there have undoubtedly been births, deaths and marriages which are not here noted. However, such omissions are unavoidable unless publication were to be postponed indefinitely. Probably each family will wish to add certain pertinent facts in its copy, and may enjoy including some family stories.

Only the family of George Washington Vernon has been followed in its entirety. The lines of his brothers and sisters appear in a book by Mrs. Greta Ramsay now in process of publication.

The labor entailed in a project of this kind may not be apparent to the casual reader. Even a simple outline such as this requires the gathering of data from many sources and much painstaking research in old records. This genealogy was begun by Mrs. Henrietta (Vernon) Davis, daughter of 1766 David Ashbridge Vernon, who was a younger brother of George Washington Vernon. The work was continued by Mrs. Davis' daughter, Mrs. Greta Ramsay, who provided much of the historical data contained in this outline. Among those who supplied important information are 1795 Mrs. Bessie Vernon Bloom; 1796 Elmer Garfield Vernon; 1815 Charles Wilmer Gooding Jr.; 1820 Mrs. Ethel Vernon Patterson; 1830 Eugene Melvin Vernon; 1853 Dorothy Mercer Vernon; and 1874 Mabel Vernon. To these, and to all others who contributed in any way, we are very grateful.

Particular thanks are due to my daughter, Alms Vernon Gonigam, and her husband Cyrus, for their help in editing and arranging the material and for carrying out the extensive work of mimeographing and mailing. They have, in addition, indicated their willingness to maintain an active file of further information (births, marriages, deaths, etc.) with the thought of distributing supplementary sheets from time to time to those who wish to keep this record up to date. VERNON FAMILY HISTORY AND GENEALOGY

Following the Line of

GEORGE WASHINGTON VERNON (1820-1901)

The Vernon family of Cheshire derives its descent from William de Vernon of the town of Vernon in Normandy, who founded and endowed, in 1052, a collegiate and parochial church for a dean and secular canons, where his effigy is found on a tomb in the castle of Vernon.

The Domesday survey notices two of the name said to be sons of William; viz: (1) Richard, and Walter (who died s.p.).

(1) Richard de Vernon, son of William of Normandy, was one of the Barons created by Hugh Lupus, to whom William the Conqueror, in the 20th year of his reign, granted the county-palatine of Chester. He was grantee of the manors of Tarvin, Picton, Warton, Hooten, Cogshull, Shipbrook, Shurlach, Leftwich, Moulton, Waron near Over, Davenham, Bostwick, Andlum, Crewe, Shavington and Bradbury. He was succeeded by his son, (2) William.

(2) William de Vernon, son of (1) Richard de Vernon, became Lord of the Manor of Shipbrook. He was succeeded by his son, (3) Hugh.

(3) Hugh de Vernon, son of (2) William de Vernon, living in 1119, married the daughter and heiress of Reginald de Baillot, Lord of Erdewick and Helgrave. Issue: (4) Warin.

(4) Warin de Vernon, son of (3) Hugh de Vernon, was the fourth Baron of Shipbrook, living in the reign of Henry III. He had three sons, of whom the eldest was (5) Richard.

(5) Richard de Vernon, son of (4) Warin de Vernon, was in possession of Shipbrook in the reign of Richard I. By deed dated in Paris 1195, Richard de Vernon and Richard his son, by command of Richard I, King of England, quit-claimed to Philip, King of France, Vernon town and castle and Longusville, in exchange for which they received other lands, rated at five knight's fees, subject to a rent of 80 pounds. He left five sons; viz: (6) Warine, Richard, Ralph, William and Robert.

(6) Warine de Vernon, son of (5) Richard de Vernon, was a Baron of Shipbrook in the reign of King John. He married Auda, daughter and heiress of William de Malbank, Baron Wich Malbank (now Nanptwich, Cheshire), and widow of Hugh de Alteribus. She was living in the reign of Henry III (1220). Issue: Baron Warine, who married Margery de Andeville, who left no male issue surviving, and (7) Ralph.

(7) Ralph de Vernon, son of (6) Warine and Auda (de Malbank) de Vernon, was rector of Hanwell. He recovered a moiety of the barony from his nieces, which included the Manor of Minshal-Vernon and Manor of Shipbroke. He levied a fine on his lands in Shipbroke, etc., 19th Edward II. Issue: (8) Sir Ralph and Thomas.

(8) Sir Ralph de Vernon, Knt., son of (7) Ralph, rector of Hanwell, married (a) Mary, daughter of Ralph, Lord Dacres; married (b) Maud Grosvenor, sister of Robert Grosvenor, of Great Budworth, Cheshire, and widow of John Hatton. By his first wife, daughter of Lord Dacres, he had issue seven children: viz: Roese, who married Sir Hugh de Brereton, Knt.; Agatha, wife of Sir Hugh Venables, Knt.; Nicholas; (9) Thomas; Hugh; Sir Ralph de Vernon, Knt., married Margaret, daughter of Urian de St. Pierre, a widow (13th Edward II, 1320); and Richard. Richard, who was rector of Stockport, Cheshire 1306-1334, who died s.p., and his cousin Sir Ralph de Vernon, son of his half-uncle Richard, in consequence of a settlement made by old Sir Richard, came into possession of the Barony of Shipbroke to the exclusion of the descendants of (9) Thomas. A long litigation followed and it was finally settled by compromise and the Barony of Shipbroke and other estates remained with the posterity of Richard, while Thomas' descendants enjoyed Haslington.

(9) Thomas de Vernon, second son of (8) Sir Ralph and Lady Mary (Dacres) de Vernon, called Thomas of Lostock, married circa 1316 Joane Lostock, daughter of Richard of Lostock, Lord of Lostock Gramam, and widow of William de Toft. She married (c) William de Hallum, 1336. Issue: (10) Richard.

(10) Richard de Vernon of Lostock Gramam, Cheshire, son of (9) Thomas and Joane (Lostock) de Vernon, married Avise Leigh, daughter of Thomas Leigh of Bradley. Issue: (11) Richard.

(11) Richard de Vernon of Lostock Gramam, living 12th Richard II (1389), married Margaret Molyneux, daughter of Sir Richard Molyneux. Issue: (12) James.

(12) Sir James Vernon of Haslington, son of (11) Richard and Margaret (Molyneux) Vernon, b. 1362, aged 60, 1422, d. 10th Henry VI (1432). Married (a) 1400, Alice Savage. Married (b) --- Minshall, daughter of Thomas Minshall, esq. He settled the Barony of Shipbroke on Trustees, 3rd Henry VI, who granted the same, inter alia, to Sir John Savage and Ellen his wife. (See: Vernon of Haslington, Ormerod's History of Cheshire). The Barony and its appendages are mentioned in a number of Inquisitions Post Mortem, viz:

After the death of Sir John Savage, Knt., 11th Henry VII (1496); after the death of Sir John Savage, his son, 20th Henry VIII (1529); and after the death of Sir John Savage, Knt., his grandson, 41st Elizabeth (1599).

This last inquest states that Sir John Savage, Knt., held his demesne as of fee, inter alia, the manors of Shipton, Davenham, Waverton, Aldlem, Molten, Henshull, Minshull, Vernon, Picton, Hurleston and Poole, two thirds of Leftewiche, half of Oldroade, and the renders of a pound of pepper, sixteen pairs of gloves, twenty barbed arrows and five roses, and six knight's fees in these manors and towns: viz: Shipbroke, Davenham, Waverton, Aldlem, (Molten) Henshull, Minshull-Vernon, Picton, Hurleston, Poole, Leftewicke, Road, alias Oldroade, Moreton, Shurlacke, Bradford, Newall, Hanford, Croppenhall (not Copenhall), Weigherton, Wich Malbank, alias Namptwiche, Titley, Wrenburie, Coole, Ashton, Hooten in Wyrrall, Stanthorne, Hoole, Braddley, Newbolde, Woodcoate, Alsiger, Bridge Cliffe, Hanculoe and Horton, which land, with the addition of Davenham, are held of the Queen in sapite of her Earldom of Chester, by military service.

Value of the premises in Shipbroke, Minshull-Vernon, Hurleston, Shurlach and Bradford, with appurtenances per annum XLVI £ LIII d. and of the residue XXIIII £ st. (Ormerod's History of Cheshire, Vol 3)

Issue: (13) Richard.

(13) Richard Vernon, son of (12) Sir James and --- (Minshall) Vernon, married Jane Torbeck, daughter of Richard Torbeck of Lancashire. Issue: (14) John.

(14) John Vernon, son of (13) Richard and Jane (Torbeck) Vernon, married Mabel Gifford, daughter of Henry Gifford of Staffordshire. Issue: (15) Ralph.

(15) Ralph Vernon, son of (14) John and Mabel (Gifford) Vernon, married (a) Joan Fowlhurst, daughter of Rowland Fowlhurst, of Crew. Married (b) Mary Dutton, daughter of John Dutton and widow of Thomas Ashton. Issue by first wife: (16) Richard.

(16) Richard Vernon, son of (15) Ralph and Joan (Fowlhurst) Vernon, married Margaret Rape, of Stapley, Cheshire, daughter of Lawrence Rape, of Cheshire, Knight. Issue: (17) Ralph.

(17) Ralph Vernon, son of (16) Richard and Margaret (Rape) Vernon, married Isabella Leverage, daughter of Thomas Leverage of Wheelock, Esq. Issue: (18) Robert.

(18) Robert Vernon, Esq., son of (17) Ralph and Isabella (Leverage) Vernon, married Cecilia Fowlhurst, of Crew, Cheshire, daughter of Robert Fowlhurst, of Crew, Cheshire. Issue: (19) Sir Thomas.

(19) Sir Thomas Vernon, Knight, son of (18) Robert and Cecilia (Fowlhurst) Vernon, d. 1615; married Dorothy Egerton, daughter of William Egerton, Esq., of Betley. Sir Thomas Vernon was of Haslington, Cheshire. Issue: (20) Sir George.

(20) Sir George Vernon, Knight, of Haslington, son of (19) Sir Thomas and Dorothy (Egerton) Vernon, married (a) Jane Corbett, daughter of Sir George Corbett of Morton Corbett, County Salop. He was a Judge of Common Pleas. Issue: (21) Muriel.

(21) Muriel Vernon, daughter of (20) Sir George and Jane (Corbett) Vernon, married Henry Vernon, son of Sir Edward and Margaret (Vernon) Vernon. Henry, b. 1686, was the great-grandfather of the first Lord Vernon.

The name "de Redvers", from Reviere, in Normandy, was assumed by a Vernon in the eleventh century. His family were "Comtes de Revieres and Vernon and Baron de Nehon", both families traced from the d'Ivry stock.

Mauriscus d'Ivry (father of Robert d'Ivry), who was the father of Alselin Goel---the names of whose sons, Roger Pincerna, surnamed "the stammerer", Lord of the Castle of Grossoeuvre, William Lupellus (Lovel), who acquired the castle of Ivry on the death of his elder brother; and Robert Goel---are all well known in history; the one as holding the Honour of Ivry in the right of his descent from Count Ralph, uterine-brother of Richard I, Duke of Normandy, another as the founder of the family of Lovel; and the third as having held, as his, the castle of Grossoeuvre against King Stephen. He had a son, Baldwin, who took the surname of De Redvers from the place of his residence; and two generations later, William, the son of Richard, assumed the name of Vernon, from the Chatellenie of that name which he held.

His son, Hugh De Revers, or Vernon, (usually called Hugh de Nonachus), founded the Abbey of Montebourg. Hugh De Revers had a son, William De Vernon,

Lord of Vernon. By his wife, Emma, he had issue: two sons, Walter and Richard, the latter of whom, Richard de Redvers (as the name was afterwards spelled), or Vernon, came over at the Conquest, and was created Baron of Shipbroke in Cheshire, by his Uncle Hugh Lupus (Prince). Richard de Vernon married Adeliza, daughter of William Peverill of Nottingham, and received with her in Frank marriage---that is, a free gift of an estate given with a wife on her marriage, and descendable to their joint heirs---the manor of Wolleigh, Buckinghamshire. One of their sons, Baldwin de Redvers, was created Earl of Devon, and from him descended the line of Earls of that name; while William de Redvers, who inherited the Norman baronies of Vernon, Revieres and Nehon, re-assumed the name of Vernon from these possessions. He had an only son and heir, Hugh de Vernon, Baron of Shipbroke, who married a daughter of Raynold Badgioll, Lord of Erdiswicke and Holgrave. By this lady he had numerous issue: the eldest, Warin, continuing the Barony of Shipbroke; Mathew, inheriting the lordships of Erdiswicke and Holgrave, who was the ancestor of the Vernons of those places; and Richard. This Richard de Vernon married Avise, the daughter and co-heiress of William de Avenell, Lord of Haddon; his other daughter and co-heiress marrying Sir Simon Bassett. By marriage with this lady, Richard Vernon acquired Haddon and other estates, and thus became settled at Haddon Hall.

The Vernon Family in America

The family of Vernon of Cheshire is one of the most ancient in England, dating from the Norman Conquest. (1) Richard de Vernon, who was the son of William, Lord of Vernon, in Normandy, had a grant of Shipbroke in Cheshire, before Doomsday. His son, (2) William, was Baron of Shipbroke and from them derive, apparently, all of the name in this country (America).

From this neighborhood six hundred years later came three brothers to America: Thomas, Randall, and Robert Vernon, with whom we must begin our account of the family in America. According to the late A. R. Justice, who made an exhaustive study of the Vernon family, the immediate ancestor of the three Vernon brothers was James Vernon, whose wife was Esther. She died 4/1/1675.

#1. James Vernon and Esther (Hester) of Cheshire, England, who probably lived in the neighborhood of Davenham, between Norwich and Middlewich, had three sons who came to Pennsylvania about July 1682. These sons were Thomas, Randall and Robert.

#2. Thomas Vernon of Stanthorne, near Middlewich, County Palatine, Chester, England, was supposed to be the eldest son. He had been persecuted for being a Quaker in 1678-9. He brought with him to America his wife, Elizabeth, and son Thomas aged about 12 years. He settled near New Providence, Pa., and died December 25, 1698, buried at Chester, Pa. His widow died 5/24/1714. The son, Thomas, married 8/13/1702 Lydia Ralfe. He was born about 1670, died 11/4/1754.

#3. Randall Vernon of Sandiway in the parish of Weaversham, County Cheshire, England, believed to be the second son, was born in England about 1640. He married (being then of Marton) 9/14/1670 at the home of Thomas Vernon of Stanthorne in the parish of Middlewich, Sarah Bradshaw of Stanthorne.

On account of religious persecution, he migrated from Cheshire, England with his two brothers, Thomas and Robert, and arrived in this country a short time before William Penn, in 1682 (?), settling in lower Providence township. For further details of the Vernon lineage, see Burk's Lineage 1054.

Sarah Bradshaw, wife of Randall Vernon, was probably related to John Bradshaw, who was appointed Premier of England after Charles I was beheaded. She died 12/18/1718. Randall Vernon came to Pennsylvania with his family in July, 1682. In 1687 he served as a member of the Pa. Assembly. He died in 1724, aged 85 years. His will dated August 2, 1715, probated May 4, 1725.

#4. Robert Vernon of Stokes in the parish of Acton, County Cheshire, England, the third son, also came to Pennsylvania in July 1682, with his wife, Eleanor Minshall, daughter of John Minshall, and their son Jacob. Robert was living in 1710 and deceased in 1720. She died 7/24/1720. (According to Friends Records they must have brought more than one child with them. See list of their children G. U. R.)

Eleanor Minshall was the daughter of John Minshall, and the sister of Thomas Minshall, another settler from England.

#2. Thomas and #3. Randall Vernon occupied the same house for some time after settling in Nether Providence, Chester (now Delaware) County, Pa. Both were active members of the Society of Friends. Their home was often used as a Meeting House.

#3. Randall Vernon was a member of the Provincial Assembly 1687. He was a Justice of the Peace 1692. See Penna. Archives, 2nd Series, Vol. 9, pages 676-683. Also Penna. Marriages, Vol. 2.

#3. Randall Vernon settled on a tract of 298 acres lying north of #2. Thomas Vernon's land. Todmorden is at the lower end of this plantation, and the South branch of Vernon's Run is almost entirely within its boundaries. Randall Vernon was from Sandyway, England. He died at the above plantation in 1724-5 in his 85th year. The homestead passed to Joseph Vernon.

Above #3. Randall Vernon's land, #4. Robert Vernon took up 7/23/1682, 350 acres which extended from Ridley Creek to Upper Providence line, its eastern boundary being Providence Road. On this tract was the main stem of Vernon Run, almost all that part of Media borough in Nether Providence is located on the original Vernon estate. Early in 1709-10 just before his death, he conveyed the homestead tract and brick messuage thereon to his son, Jacob Vernon.

#4. Robert Vernon's land purchased May 19, 1702, from Joshua Hastings, extended from Ridley Creek to Providence Road. Robert conveyed it to his son John and Sarah his wife.

Above this tract was a plot of 250 acres purveyed to #2. Thomas Vernon 10/16/1702. #2. Thomas Vernon was the grandfather of Nathaniel Vernon, the noted Tory Sheriff of Chester County during the Revolutionary War. The property of Thomas Vernon extended on the Providence Road a short distance above Hinkson's Corners.

The above account of the Vernon property was taken from Colonial Families, Vol. 7.

#2. Thomas Vernon served as first juror at the first court held for the County of Chester. He was a yeoman. He was an exemplary member of the Society of Friends and a good citizen. He had not entirely escaped religious persecution in England.

1748. George Vernon was dismissed from the Society of Friends in 1776. "He was interested in some degree in the preparations of the country for war with Great Britain." (Cope's records and Ashbridge Genealogy.)

1748. George Vernon's name appears in the list of persons enrolled in Capt. Curtes Lowne's Company of Militia, commanded by Lt. Col. Richard Willing, Commander of the 4th Batt. Chester Co. for the year 1783. (Pa. Archives, 5th series, Vol. LV, page 679)

The following is from Thomas Cheyney's Docket as copied by Gilbert Cope:

1748. "George Vernon of West Whiteland and Susanna Ashbridge of West Whiteland, married April 13, 1789 by Thomas Cheyney, Esq. Witnesses: Thomas Cheyney, Mary Cheyney, Thomas Cooper, John Marshall, Jonathan Livezey, William Cheyney, Joseph Cheyney, Abel Cheyney, Curteous Cheyney, Jabus Lewis, Alice Cheyney, Betsey Cheyney, Mary Cheyney, Sidney Johnson."

In the 1790 census, 1748. George Vernon is listed as of West Whiteland, one son under sixteen, wife and servant.

Chester Co., Pa. deed 1794: 1748. George Vernon of West Whiteland, saddler, and Susanna, his wife, and Hannah Ashbridge of Goshen, spinster, conveyed to 1756. Joseph Vernon of Goshen 96 acres of land for 300 pounds, of which David Ashbridge died seized, leaving two daughters, Susanna and Hannah.

1748. George Vernon was born 1762 and died intestate 1828. Letters were granted to 1759. Rufus and 1756. Joseph Vernon Sept. 8, 1828.

2986. Susanna Ashbridge was the daughter of 2924. David and Mary (Powell) Ashbridge. Mary Powell was the daughter of David Powell and Susanna Williamson. Susanna Ashbridge was born 1770. She died in 1822 and was buried at Goshen Friends' ground.

1784. Mabel Vernon was born in Wilmington, Delaware, educated in the Wilmington Friends' School and Swarthmore College where she received the degree of Bachelor of Arts. She was a teacher of Latin and German in Radnor High School, Wayne, Pa., later traveled and studied in Europe, and then did graduate work at Columbia University, receiving the degree of Master of Arts in the faculty of Political Science.

Miss Vernon took an active part in the movement for national woman's suffrage as a leader in the National Woman's Party. For several years she was a national officer of the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom. In connection with the work of these organizations, she traveled throughout the United States speaking and organizing in every state, and several times went to Europe to speak at international conferences and to work in Geneva during sessions of the League of Nations.

In 1935 Miss Vernon initiated the Peoples' Mandate to End War, a petition to governments which was circulated in fifty nations. Since that time she has directed the work of the Peoples' Mandate Committee for the Western Hemisphere, composed of well known women in all the American republics.

Under Miss Vernon's direction the Committee has carried out a number of outstanding projects. She led the delegation of prominent women who flew to Buenos Aires to present to the Inter-American Conference for the Maintenance of Peace the petition for a peaceful settlement of all disputes, signed by two million citizens of the American republics. She was the leader of the Mandate delegation to the Pan American Conference in Lima and was given the unusual privilege of speaking before the Conference, an honor which has been accorded to few women.

Miss Vernon directed the delegation of Mandate representatives who toured the American republics in support of the ratification of the Buenos Aires Peace Treaties, were received by the President and Foreign Minister, honored by women's organizations and heard at popular mass meetings in every country. She organized and conducted the Good Will Tour of the United States by a group of Latin American women who traveled from coast to coast, addressed university and college assemblies and spoke at meetings in forty cities. She was chairman of the Peoples' Mandate delegation, composed of representatives of many of the American republics, at the United Nations Conference in San Francisco, where the Committee opposed the incorporation of the veto power in the charter.

Under Miss Vernon's direction, a delegation of Mandate members carried the "Declaration of Principles" to the Paris Peace Conference, personally interviewed the chief of every national delegation and arranged to have the Declaration made an official document of the Conference.

Miss Vernon and the other Mandate officers carried an "Appeal to the Pan American Nations" to the Inter American Conference in Bogota, Columbia, in 1948, which was made famous by one of the most violent uprisings in South American history. The "Appeal" urging united American action to save mankind from destruction called on the 21 Pan American republics to work in the United Nations for a comprehensive program, creating a world police force, prohibiting all weapons of mass destruction and reducing national armaments to a police force in each country to maintain internal order.

Miss Vernon is now concentrating on work for this program in the Americas and in the United Nations.

Miss Vernon's work has been widely recognized in the American republics. She has been awarded the decoration "Al Merito" by the Republic of Ecuador with the citation "in recognition of valuable service rendered to justice and international cooperation".

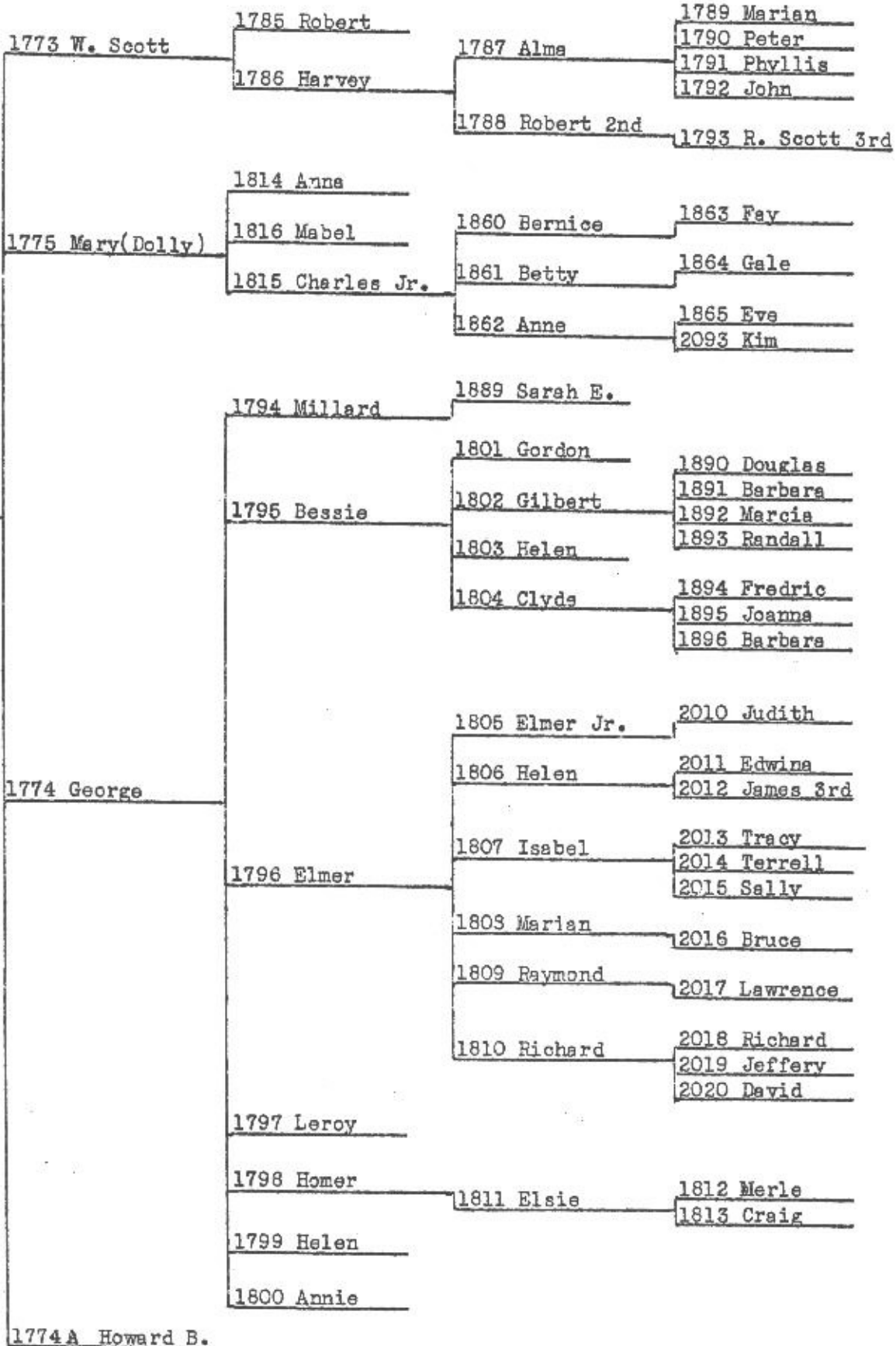
